How does it work?

There are 4 ways to participate:

Swap – bring in your gently used school clothing and “swap” for new-to-you items. It’s a great way to save money and get refreshed or larger sizes for your PISD student.

Donate – Donate your gently used items! We are always in need of donated items to provide to kids in need right here in our district. Your donation may be tax deductible, and a tax receipt is available for all donations.

Voucher - A voucher allows families in need to get donated items from the Shop. If you or someone you know is in need of some help from the Shop, you may obtain a voucher directly from your child’s school by contacting your school nurse, counselor, or principal.

Volunteer - Volunteers are always needed! The Swap Shop is run by volunteers from PTAs throughout the district, and we always appreciate any extra help!

Acceptable Clothing Guidelines

- ◆ We accept PISD standardized dress code clothing: solid-color polo shirts, solid-color pants (jeans, or black, navy, or khaki colored), jumpers, skirts/skorts, shorts (for elementary grades only), belts (no big chains or logos), jackets, and sweaters.
- ◆ We also accept lunch kits, backpacks, and new or gently-worn shoes.
- ◆ All clothes should be free of stains (including ink, marker, or pencil marks), and should be washed and neatly folded with no missing buttons, tears or any other flaws to the fabric.
- ◆ We will not accept hats or undergarments.
- ◆ Belts can only be swapped for belts.
- ◆ A Swap Shop/Community Closet representative has authority to accept or reject any items.

The Formal Closet

To Provide Formal Wear Attire for Student Banquet & Prom Season



What is The Formal Closet?

The Formal Closet is part of the Pearland Council of PTAs Swap Shop/Community Closet - and will offer gently used formal attire in an effort to assist PISD families in need. The formal wear can be used for prom, booster club banquets, or other school-related events.

How does it work?

Swap – bring in your gently used formal wear and “swap” for new-to-you formal wear. Note: formal wear items can ONLY be swapped for another formal wear item - regular Swap Shop items (such as school uniform attire) is not eligible to be swapped for formal wear.

Donate – Donate your gently used formal wear! Your donation may be tax deductible, and a tax receipt is available for all donations.

Voucher - Families in need should contact their school Nurse, Counselor, CIS Rep, or School Administration to obtain a voucher for formal wear items. The Formal Wear Closet's Voucher Program is based upon available inventory only, and is valid for one (1) set of girl's formal wear (can include one (1) gown and one (1) pair of shoes); or one (1) set of boy's formal wear (can include one each of necktie, shirt, suit jacket, pants, and formal shoes).

Formal Wear Guidelines:

- ◆ Girl's formal wear: gowns, heeled shoes, formal handbags
- ◆ Boy's formal wear: neckties, shirts, suit jackets, pants, formal shoes
- ◆ Items MUST be formal gowns/attire – no cotton or casual dresses
- ◆ Acceptance of swapped formal wear is at the sole discretion of the Swap Shop Coordinators
