# **Course Description**

Theatre Arts will have everyone using and developing their gifts in areas such as acting, voice, movement, and leadership. Production will continue the student's journey into the theatre and acting process. This is an ADVANCED level class. Students will be expected to memorize and be engaged in the class. Students must participate in classroom activities and after school productions to achieve their grade. The students auditioned to be a part of the class, and they are the best of the best. Production 1 students are in preparation to move into the leadership roles of the department, and they are expected to audition for all the shows. Production 2,3,4 students are a part of the competition group that produces the UIL One Act Play. This is a requirement of the class, and every student will be a part of the production. I am excited to work with all the students this year!

## Canvas

We will be using Canvas this year for all our assignments and major projects. Our commitment is to be creative and help one another have the best experience in the class as possible. Using online tools allows us to find talents that we have in the technology world and apply that to our online creations.

## Collaboration

Theatre by nature is a collaboration, and you will be given the opportunity to work together. We will use all the resources given to us through Canvas, Editing Software, Zoom and Teams, and any other technology that keeps us working and creating together. This is a project-based class, so get ready to have some fun and be creative.

# Late Work Policy

Students may turn in assignments 4 days past the original due date to receive a grade up to 70. Chronic abuse, more than three late assignments during any one nine-week grading period, may result in additional consequences. Extenuating circumstances may occur that are out of the control of the student which may prevent him/her from completing and returning homework assignments. The student is to inform the teacher of any such circumstances that prevented the completion of the homework. Teachers may grant exceptions to this regulation, as necessary. Long-term projects and term papers that are assigned during the semester are due on the announced due date. The due date must be given at least 2 weeks' notice before the assignment starts. A student who is absent for any reason on the due date, including school business, must meet the deadline. The teacher will accept all late papers/projects turned in up to two weeks after the due date for the purpose of providing feedback, but a grade of zero will be assigned.

I am looking to provide a creative and fun learning environment, and I am confident that you will be successful and engaged! **Theatre Appreciation hours are a part of your grade**, and I am including the point system at the end of the syllabus.

# Classroom Expectations and Discipline

The most important things you'll need to be successful in this class are a **POSITIVE ATTITUDE**, a **CREATIVE IMAGINATION** and **SELF-DISCIPLINE**. Before we begin, we must set some ground rules.

- 1. **D**ecide to try: make a choice and take a risk.
- 2. **R**espect each other: ideas, feelings, boundaries, and turns.
- 3. **A**ct with the 3 Cs: concentration, commitment, and creativity.
- 4. **M**ove safely: control your body.
- 5. **A**pplaud each other: show audience etiquette.

Additionally, the Black Box Theatre classroom, Theatre Tech classroom, and the auditorium will always be free of food and beverage. Chairs and tables are numbered. The chairs must stay where they are assigned.

# Cell Phone Policy

Theatre is a class about life. Learning to communicate with one another. Connecting with fellow human beings. Because Theatre is about human interaction, technology can often be a distraction. When we, as teachers, must spend time redirecting students from notifications, texts, games, music, etc., it is valuable learning time that is being wasted. While technology is great, (and we all love social media, as well), there is an appropriate time for it, and the classroom is not it. To cut down on the distractions in class, we will not use phones as devices for learning in the classroom.

No cell phones or earbuds in the classroom without permission from the teacher. They need to be in your backpack, or in your teacher's storage/charging area, not on your desk or lap.

Students may charge their phones in the designated charging area. Other outlets around the classroom are not to be used for charging phones.

Days/times we are using technology, no games, texting, videos, or social media is allowed.

The teacher may take up a student's phone if the student is in violation of the class policies.

Teachers may utilize a random "Two Minute Tech Check" for students to check technology during class if/when there is a convenient time. This will only be used as a reward for classes that follow the technology rules on a regular basis.

#### Theatre Appreciation Hours

Students are required to obtain 10 or 20 Theatre hours per 9 weeks (depending on their class level). The students can earn hours in the ways listed below.

**Hours will count as one test grade and one daily grade per 9 weeks**. Not having the required points will cause the student's overall average to drop and could cause them to fail the 9 weeks. Students will track their hours using an online form, and hours can roll over into the next 9 weeks if students have more than the requirement.

#### Theatre 1/Tech 1 10 hours per 9 weeks -REQUIRED

Points can be obtained by, but not limited to:

- Working after school on shows (1 hour per hour worked)
- Being cast or crew in a show (4-8 hours/points based on Thespian points)
- Attending events such as Welcoming Party and Parent Showcases
- Attending live theatre performances at PHS
- Attending live theatre performances at other schools or theatres in community
- Donating items to concessions (1 hour per item items chosen by directors)
- Fundraisers such as Car Washes or Jr. High Theatre Festival (1 hour per shift)
- Parents & students signing up for Remind (1/2 hour)
- Participating actively in Thespian meetings (1 hour per meeting)
- Participating in other fundraisers such as Spirit Nights or catalogue sales
- Other ways as deemed by Directors–varies

### Theatre 2, 3 and 4 and Theatre Tech 2 20 hours per 9 weeks - REQUIRED

#### Production and Tech 3 and 4 - 20 hours per 9 weeks - REQUIRED

- Attending live theatre performances at PHS
- Attending events such as Welcoming Party and Parent Showcases
- Attending live theatre performances at other facilities (.5 hours/points per show based on Thespian points. Can earn more if written critique is added.)
- Attending Texas Thespian Festival
- Donating items to concessions (1 hour per item items chosen by directors)
- Fundraisers such as Car Washes or Jr. High Theatre Festival (1 hour per shift)
- Parents & students signing up for Remind (1/2 hour)
- Participating actively in Thespian meetings (1 hour per meeting)
- Participating in other fundraisers such as Spirit Nights or catalogue sales
- Other ways as deemed by Directors-varies

#### **After school Hour Opportunities Theatre 1-4**

- -After school hands on times Tuesday, Wednesday, & Thursday 3:00-4 pm weekly
- -Parents sign up for Remind (1/2 hour)
