Jaguar Parents/Guardians,

Welcome to Sam Jamison PE for the 2022-2023 School Year! We are so excited to have an excellent year being active and having fun with your 5th and 6th graders. We wanted to give you a little bit of information about PE here at Jamison to help us work together towards a successful year.

PE ATTIRE & SHOES –

We do not use the locker rooms to dress out. There is not enough time for all students to change in and out of clothes for PE. As such, on their PE days students should come prepared to run and play. If the weather is good, we may go outside. If it is cold, they should bring or wear a jacket or sweater. Students wearing skirts MUST have something underneath. If they have on a tank top or crop top under a sweater or hoodie, they will not be allowed to take off the sweater or hoodie as they are then out of dress code for our campus. Students should be wearing their PE appropriate shoes (supportive around feet and ankles, closed toe & rubber sole) all day on their PE days. They will not be allowed to bring shoes to change into during PE. Jaguars do NOT wear Crocs, any kind of boots or booties, sandals, HeyDudes, or anything with a heel while in PE. This is to protect our student's ankles and feet as well as our gym floor.

BELONGINGS –

Students should only bring a water and a jacket/sweater if needed to PE. They do not need earbuds, laptops or cell phones. They will have an assigned cubby, but it is not able to lock and will not be monitored during class, so bringing any valuables is not recommended.

GRADES –

Your student's PE grade is based on participation. We don't ask for perfection and we understand not all kids are naturally athletic, but everyone should make an attempt to participate. If they don't wear the correct shoes or attire, they can't participate, and their grade will be docked accordingly. Citizenship grades are based on conduct, effort and attitude.

BEHAVIOR EXPECTATIONS –

Students are expected to follow all school behaviors and expectations while in the gym. This includes the use of appropriate language and keeping their hands to themselves. PE can be at times competitive and many students are still learning how to channel their personal expectations and how to work together in groups and on teams. We expect students to be responsible with any PE equipment and respectful with their words and actions. PE works together with your student's other elective teachers with a conduct card if necessary. The conduct infractions are as follows:

- 1st Offense: Verbal Warning
- 2nd Offense: Redirection
- 3rd Offense: Successful Parent Contact
- 4th Offense: Lunch Detention
- 5th Offense: Afterschool Detention
- 6th Offense: Office Referral
