TAC – Texas Administrative Code is the official compilation of all final state agency rules published in the Texas Register.

TIE – Technology Integration in Education is information about how technology is being integrated into Texas schools.

TMHP – Texas Medicaid and Healthcare Partnership

TOPT – Texas Oral Proficiency Test – part of the teacher certification process – must be passed to obtain an elementary or secondary French, elementary or secondary Spanish or bilingual teaching certificate.

TRS – Teacher Retirement System of Texas

TSBVI – Texas School for the Blind and Visually Impaired

TSD – Texas School for the Deaf

TSIA – Texas Success Initiative Assessment

TSII – Texas School Improvement Initiative is (1) a statewide educational leadership network; (2) a group of school district representatives trained in effective school practices; (3) practitioners with expertise in analyzing student outcomes, planning, decision-making and evaluating programs; and (4) practitioners who participate in on-site peer review evaluations.

TSSAS – Texas Successful Schools Award System (under the Texas Education Code, Section 39.092), provides financial awards to schools that have demonstrated the highest sustained success or the greatest improvement in achieving education goals.

TSTA – Texas State Teacher Association

T-PESS – Texas Principal Evaluation and Support System

T-STAR – Texas School Telecommunications Access Resource is a statewide satellite network linking Texas districts, regional education service centers and the Texas Education Agency to satellite service providers across the country.

T-TESS – Texas Teacher Evaluation and Support System replaces PDAS as the state’s teacher evaluation system supporting teachers in their professional growth. It measures teacher effectiveness through observation, teacher self-assessment and student growth.

WADA – Weighted Average Daily Attendance measures the extent that a district's students in average daily attendance participate in special programs (e.g., special education, career and technical education and bilingual, compensatory and gifted education). WADA is used to calculate a district's TIER II entitlement and determine wealth status and recapture amounts.

WSD – The Windham School District was established by the Texas Legislature as an entity separate and distinct from the Texas Department of Criminal Justice. The Texas Board of Criminal Justice serves as WSD's board of trustees.
