February 9, 2021 Regular Board Meeting

Superintendent Dr. John Kelly and Executive Director Dr. Sundie Dahlkamp participated in closed session with the board in regard to all items listed.

Open Session 4.0 - The board reconvened in open session at 6:33 p.m. All board members were present.

Action on Closed Session Items 5.0 - **No items were presented for approval.**

Introductory Remarks 6.0 –Trustees Schoeffler thanked everyone for their support and expressed his goals as a board member. He asked for a moment of silence and then rendered a prayer. Trustee Schoeffler led the Pledge of Allegiance to the American and Texas Flags.

The deadline to submit the completed form was prior to 5:00 p.m. on Monday, February 8, 2021 for anyone who wished to address the Board of Trustees on an agenda or non-agenda item.

Ananya Amar, Sophia Wilson, Vidya Muthupillai and Alice Murphey – all four students at DHS - each expressed dissatisfaction with COVID-19 management at the school.

TAPR Hearing 8.0 **President Murphy opened the Pubic Hearing at 6:25 pm**

Texas Education Code Chapter 39 requires each district’s board of trustees to publish the Texas Academic Performance Report (TAPR), campus performance objectives, a report of violent or criminal incidents, and information received under Texas Education Code §51.403(e) from the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board.

Director of Testing Dr. Ellen Akers answered questions presented by members of the board. The TAPR report for 2019-2020 is incomplete for all school districts in Texas due to the cancellation of spring 2020 state assessment tests. Information presented included highlights and information such as annual dropout rates and college readiness indicators. Texas Education Code §11.253 also requires that each campus improvement plan set objectives based on the TAPR and periodically measure progress toward the performance objectives.

President Murphy declared the public hearing closed at 6:37 p.m.

Board Recognition 9.0 –No recognition was presented due to COVID social distancing precautions

Subject: Approve Missed School Day Waiver for Consideration by TEA.

Executive Summary: Pearland ISD was forced to close all campus and district facilities as a result of inclement weather, power outages, and loss of water pressure in the city of Pearland from February 16 to February 19, 2021. The district previously used the two built-in “bad weather days” in the fall semester when Tropical Storm Beta visited. Closing the schools beyond those two “built in” days requires TEA approval in order to receive full state funding.

The Texas Education Agency allows districts to apply for a Missed School Day Waiver due to inclement weather when it applies to the closure of the schools with no instruction provided. TEA announced waivers would be granted for the conditions encountered in different parts of the state; therefore, fast approval is anticipated.

Although the district had planned to provide “asynchronous instruction” on some or all of the days missed, major power shortages and cell service breakdowns prevented the vast majority of our families from having access to the Internet – in addition to many encountering widespread water related deficiencies and damage to residences. The sum total of these difficulties meant that a very small percentage of the student population could receive instruction. Moreover, many teachers and staff were similarly indisposed for such purposes.

If this approval is not granted, the district would be forced to re-schedule graduation, lengthen the school year into June and/or add a substantial number of minutes to the daily schedule (which was already lengthened for 2019-20 and 2021).

<p>Dr. Nyla Watson</p>	<p>Waivers Under Chapter 7 of the Texas Education Code, districts and charter schools may apply to the Commissioner of Education for a waiver of a requirement, restriction, or prohibition imposed by the education code or rule of the board or commissioner. See the attached four requests.</p> <p>Missed School Day Waiver: This waiver is for days when the district infrastructure has issues due to outages and its related impacts preventing the district from providing remote instruction. A waiver is requested for Feb. 16-19 for these missed days.</p> <p>Required CPR Waiver: State law (TEC 29.0023) requires school districts and open-enrollment charter schools to provide instruction in cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) to students in grades 7-12; students must receive the instruction at least once before graduating high school. A waiver is requested for students graduating in 2021 that may not have received instruction in CPR since it is a graduation requirement. This is primarily students new to Texas or ARD exempt.</p>	

Hybrid Instruction During District-Scheduled Testing Days for K-8th Grade Students Waiver:

For students in Kindergarten through grade 8, districts may require students who are not scheduled to take an assessment to learn remotely on district-scheduled testing days in order to reduce the number of individuals on a campus at any one time and increase the number of remote students that come on campus to take the assessment. This waiver applies for district-scheduled STAAR testing days. A waiver for grades 5-8th is requested for hybrid instruction.

Hybrid Instruction During District-Scheduled Testing Days for grades 9-12th:

If districts cannot assess all students during the district-scheduled assessment days and comply with local health protocols, the district can submit a waiver to require students who are not scheduled to take that assessment to learn remotely on a scheduled testing day. For students in grades 9-12, districts already have access to flexibility through the 40% Campus Hybrid Instruction for 9-12th Students Waiver. A waiver for grades 9-12 is requested for a hybrid schedule.

Both of these waivers regarding testing days will allow for social distancing, adequate staffing for test administration, and a safe and secure testing environment for all students.

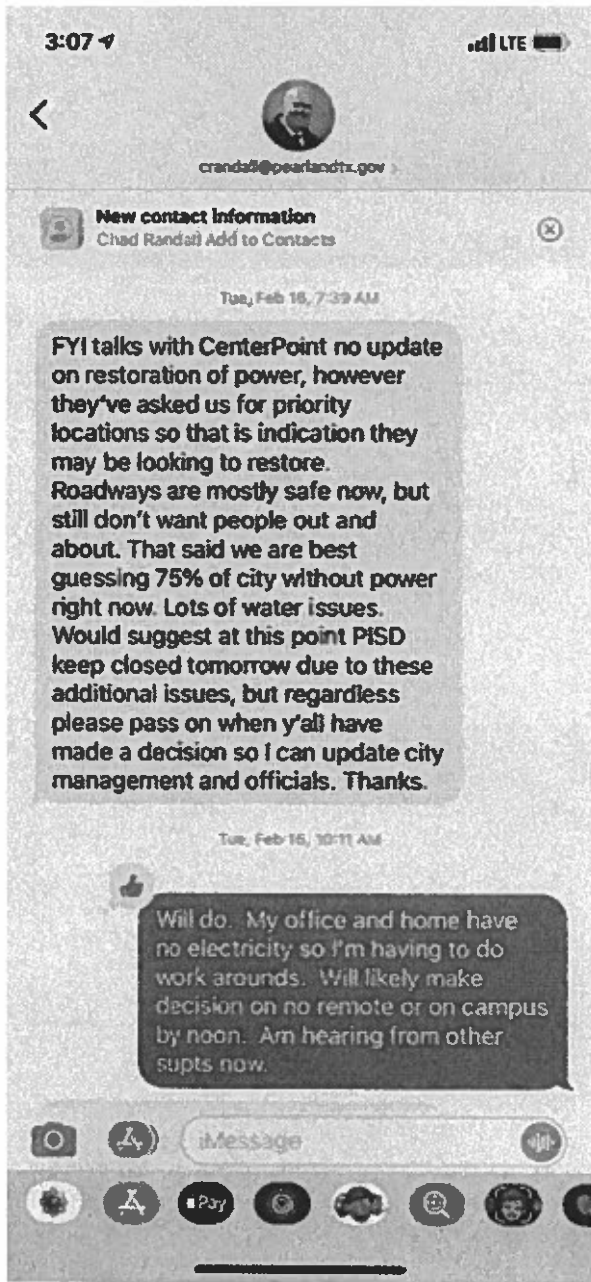

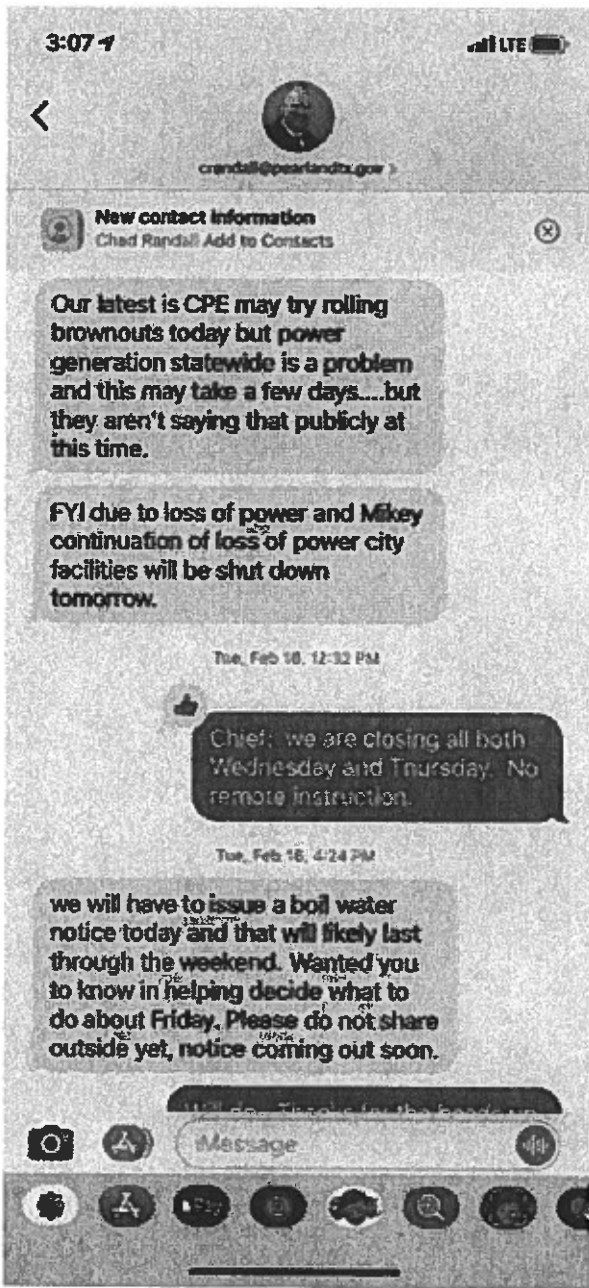

City of Pearland Boil Water Notice Rescinded

PEARLAND, TEXAS – February 21, 2021 — On February 16, 2021, the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality required the City of Pearland public water system, PWS 0200008 to issue a Boil Water Notice to inform customers, individuals, or employees that due to conditions which occurred recently in the public water system, the water from this public water system was required to be boiled prior to use for drinking water or human consumption purposes.

The public water system has taken the necessary corrective actions to restore the quality of the water distributed by this public water system used for drinking water or human consumption purposes and has provided TCEQ with laboratory test results that indicate that the water no longer requires boiling prior to use as of February 21, 2021 at 3 p.m.

Residents are advised to flush any residual water that could be left from before the notice was lifted. This includes hot water heaters, ice made by ice machines, and water in the water lines if it has not been used recently.
