Dear Parent:

Your child has signed up for a technical crew or is in a technical theatre class at Pearland High School. Work in this environment often requires maturity and training to maintain safe working conditions. I provide training on power tool use and shop safety before we allow the students to begin work, and we would like to enlist your aid in reinforcing the necessity of a safe learning environment.

You may wish to discuss with your child what he or she has learned about safety in his or her classroom work. Be certain that your child remembers to wear all proper safety equipment (goggles, safety harnesses, gloves, etc.) when appropriate while participating in technical theatre. Be certain he or she understands our shop rules concerning wood cutting tools and electricity. Be certain he or she understands the seriousness involved working with power tools.

Together we can help your son or daughter have a safe and positive experience as he or she learns skills that will help them excel in all facets of life.

Technical Theatre I

Technical Theatre I is a course designed to introduce the student to the backstage elements of the stage. Everything that is associated with the technical elements of the Theatre will be covered in this course. Sets, lights, sound, costumes, props, makeup and publicity and promotions will be looked at in detail. You have a mandatory 80 hours after school work to complete before the end of the year (20 every 9 weeks). This is a major grade every nine weeks. All students are required to go to all school theatre performances.

Tech I is a course designed to challenge the student on multiple levels. This course runs the gambit when you consider the various educational configurations which will be used to teach the backstage elements. Lecture, tests and quizzes are only a small part of the course. Design, building and participation in the productions will be a major focus for this course. If do NOT like to get dirty, then this course is NOT for you. I have been around a lot longer than Mike Rowe so I can say this with certainty, GET READY TO GET DIRTY!

Technical Theatre II-IV

Tech II is designed for the student who is SERIOUSLY interested in pursuing a career in the backstage areas of the theatre. Tech II is a continuation of where we leave off in the Tech I course. Here the students will have a major emphasis in the design elements and the stage management part of the theatre. Tech II will REQUIRE that each student participate in every production for that year in some form of capacity. This usually means that these students will take the lead as crew head positions and stage managers. There is a lot of time involved in this course. The student has to be willing to commit to the hours that are required. If they cannot do the hours, it is seriously suggested that they NOT TAKE THE COURSE.

Technical Theatre III/IV

This class meets in conjunction with the Tech II course. These students will be working independently of the Tech II students. Each of these students will have to put in at least 40 hours of work for every nine weeks, a total of 80 for the semester. This class is based upon independent design projects and work related to each production. This class is for the student who is pursuing a career in theatre technology and or backstage jobs. This course, along with the Tech IV course will be used to build the students portfolio to be presented their senior year. These portfolios will then be used at college or university interviews and or job interviews such as placement in the Local I.A.T.S.E 51 in downtown Houston. (International Alliance of Theatrical Stagehands Union) These students are the leaders of the Technical program. It will be their responsibility to care for and maintain the theater spaces here at the school. They will be in charge of crews for each of the productions and will be required to work EVERY SHOW during the year! This is not up for negotiations.

GENERAL CLASS RULES AND EXPECTATIONS

Please read the following expectations carefully. Both the student and the parent should sign this sheet indicating they have read and understand these expectations.

1. **BE ON TIME.** This is one of the most important habits to master. Excessive tardiness and absences from class are detrimental to the student's work, especially in an activity-based class.
2. **SPEND CLASS TIME ON TASK.** In an activity-based class, it is important to realize that assignments are designed to be completed in the period provided for the activity. The instructor's ability to observe and evaluate the student's work habits and the realization that a majority of theatre activity is based on short-term preparation is important.
3. **NO FOOD, DRINK, OR GUM IN CLASSROOM.**
4. **LISTEN.** This may be the most difficult skill to master. Remember, everything that is said or demonstrated in an activity class is important. NOT listening is also the most discourteous thing a student can do. It shows a lack of respect for himself and for the other students.
5. **UNDERSTAND THAT A THEATRE ARTS COURSE IS A PERFORMANCE-BASED CLASS.** Active participation and contribution is expected and necessary. The student is the text and the tool used for learning. Following classroom rules, expectations and directions is an integral part of - and cannot be disassociated from - the participation element of the student's evaluation.
6. **BE CERTAIN YOU UNDERSTAND THE POLICY FOR MAKE-UP WORK.** It is the student's responsibility to know deadlines and course requirements, and to ask for assignments after an absence, or before a school-related absence. Assignments that will be due when a student will be out of class on school or family business, should be completed BEFORE his absence.
7. **FOLLOW ALL SCHOOL RULES AND POLICIES.**

- **After School Hours are Mandatory (40 hours) Per Year! If there are any questions please check you course description. The student must get 10 hours per 9 weeks if they get more than 10 then the hours roll over to the next nine weeks. (This is a major grade / project per nine weeks)**

Skills:

- The student will be expected to improve individual theater skills.
- An evaluation of the improvement may include videotaped performances, individual performance/practicum skills evaluations, and written tests.
- The student will be evaluated on improvement of his/her group skills during class time, rehearsals, and practicum.

Fundamentals:

- The student will be expected to improve his/her skills and fundamentals.
- An evaluation of this improvement may include daily observation of students during the “basics” part of rehearsal / class time / practicum.
- Student acting, designing, directing, and producing skills will be constantly monitored during rehearsals class time for improvement.

Performances:

- The student will receive a grade for each skill set during a grading period.
- Test and afterschool hours will be counted as major exams.
- Students are required to attend all performances of the department.
- If no public performance occurs during a grading period, the performance grade will be used upon classroom performances determined by the director.

Mr. Barker will have the following grading categories:

Theatre 1/Tech 1 10 hours per 9 weeks –REQUIRED

Points can be obtained by, but not limited to:

- Working after school on shows (1 hour per hour worked)
 - Being cast or crew in a show (4-8 hours/points based on Thespian points)
 - Attending events such as Welcoming Party and Parent Showcases
 - Attending live theatre performances at PHS
